Horticultural Show Report

Petton with Cockshutt's Horticultural Show was held on Sunday 2nd September 2012 in Cockshutt Millennium Hall. The entries were down a little this year, due we think to the unhelpful growing weather through the summer.

However, the quality of entries was as high as ever, with a good selection of baking, garden produce, craft and photographs. We will challenge our imaginations for next year's Floral Art and Young Peoples' sections to hopefully tempt more people to enter.

There was a good turn out of people in the afternoon to see the results and enjoy the refreshments. Chairman Gordon Whitfield welcomed everybody, and announced the winners who were presented with their cups and certificates by Mr George Reeves.

Ivor Evans again won the Silver Perpetual Challenge Cup for the most points in the show, and the Farmer's Cup for the most points in the Produce sections.

Gordon Whitfield claimed the Red Lion Challenge Cup for Floral Art and Iona Blundred won the Pochin Perpetual Challenge cup for the combined handicraft and photographic sections.

The Perpetual Challenge Cup for the cookery section was won by Mona Whitfield, and Jack Pickett took the Bob Reeves cup for the Young Peoples' classes. Verna Roberts' entry of an embroidered table cloth won her the Crowhurst Challenge cup for the best exhibit in the show, and Rosemary Allen took the Pauline Povall Memorial Cup which is awarded to the Cockshutt WI Member with the most points in show.

The show is always at the beginning of September, and we would encourage everybody to enter. There are many people in the eligible area (6 miles of Cockshutt), with talents and skills that they are hiding, but who would make the show more interesting and exciting, and would secure it for many years to come. So please take a Schedule when they appear in Cockshutt Shop next summer and have a go.

Local Elections May 2013

On Thursday 2 May 2013 there will be local elections in many counties, towns and parishes in the United Kingdom. It will be the first election at county level since Shropshire disbanded its borough and district councils in 2009 and became a Unitary authority.

This election is your opportunity to appoint the 8 people who will be your own parish councillors for the next 4 years. If you would like to know more about being a parish councillor please contact any of the current Parish Councillors or the Parish Clerk.

The following are key dates in the election timetable that you will need to know if you plan to either stand as a candidate or vote in the elections:

by Tuesday 26 March 2013**

**Receipt of nominations:
by noon on Friday 5 April 2013**

**Last date for electors to register to be
able to vote in these elections:
by 5pm Wednesday 17 April 2013**

7.00am to 10.00pm Thursday 2 May 2013**

Housing Proposal - Retirement Bungalows in Cockshutt

Recently Severnside Housing approached the Parish Council with an opportunity to collaborate in building 14 bungalows on land in the centre of the village next to the Parklands. This development would be considered under Shropshire Council's Community-Led Housing Initiative.

Shropshire Council launched this initiative to inspire communities to take part in projects to deliver affordable homes for local people. Under the initiative a Parish Council receives a grant for each affordable home completed as part of the Project. This money can be used to fund improvements identified by and for the benefit of the whole community.

The housing proposal made to the Parish Council explained why Retirement Bungalows has been chosen for the development:

"In Cockshutt as in the rest of Britain people are living longer and the country's demographics are changing. As we look around we see more widows, widowers and aging couples. Yet no one seems to be addressing the change.

While the needs of young people and families have been addressed in recent years. The question of aging has been talked about but no one is offering solutions. People are living longer and many reach the stage where they are no longer able or willing to climb stairs, look after large gardens or even large houses.

At the present time we have a limited number of retirement bungalows in the village for which there is generally a waiting

list. As a result an aging person or couple looking for a small bungalow for either rent or purchase would more than likely have to move to Ellesmere or Whitchurch."

Prior to any planning application being submitted the first steps are:

- to determine whether there is a definite local need for this development,
- agree to proceed as part of a Community-Led Housing Project, and
- to actively involve the local community as far as possible.

A Parish Meeting will take place on Thursday 31 January at Cockshutt Millennium Hall to give you more information about the proposed development. Severnside Housing, as well as Councillors from the Parish Council, will be there to try and answer any questions.

We had a very enjoyable New Years Eve Party with some 75 revellers attending. A very tasty Hot Pot and sweet supper was provided by Phil Bell – thanks Phil, and disco music by young Ashley Downes; a good mix through to midnight and after. Well done Ash !!

On a lesser note, there have been several incidents of vandalism on the Hall site of late, including damage to the play area gate which will have to be replaced, the wooden bench in the Play area broken, the charity clothes bin broken into and contents scattered on the hall roof and one of the goal posts demolished. At some expense we have installed closed circuit cameras on site as a deterrent to and evidence of any further such mindless acts .
