Welcome .....

to the second issue of 'Our Parish Matters'. We had a good response to the first issue and we hope to further enlighten residents on the many and varied activities which are taking place in the Parish.

May was a very busy meeting month for the Parish Council - reports and updates are included in this issue. The Council is now currently progressing a number of projects, for example, a dedicated Parish Council notice board located on Church Green Cockshutt (with the kind permission of the Meres and Mosses Housing Association) and the resurfacing of Alley Walk, Crosemere Road and Dommett Walk, Cockshutt churchyard. There is also the acquisition of the plot of land behind Wimbourne Cottages, Cockshutt. Once the transfer has been completed, the Parish Council will initiate, with key community partners, a period of consultation with parishioners about the future use of the land to ensure the land and any facilities are utilised to their maximum potential.

Following on from the Community Testing Event, the Parish Council will be discussing the merits of a Parish Plan for our Parish in its meetings in the autumn. If you would like to know more about Parish Plans visit

*Traffic Issues - an update*

## **Speed Limit Extensions**

Shropshire Council are currently preparing proposals for speed limit extensions at Cockshutt and it will send these out for informal consultation with the Parish Council and other partners hopefully within the next 4 to 6 weeks.

## **Rural Roads Speed Limit Policy**

Shropshire Council has confirmed that the A528 between Cockshutt and Ellesmere is a prioritised route that has been identified for review, however, unfortunately there is no funding available to progress anything this financial year.

## **Vehicle Activated Sign (VAS)**

With regard to the Parish Council's request for the installation of a VAS in Cockshutt to reinforce the existing 30mph speed limit, Shropshire Council has confirmed that a suitable location has been identified in the middle of the village and speed readings have been carried out.

The speed readings show that the likely funding arrangement for the VAS would be 50% Shropshire Council/50% Parish Council. The Parish Council will be receiving a letter shortly setting out all this information, including a photograph of the proposed VAS site, for their consideration.

## *Cockshutt Millennium Hall*

The Millennium Hall continues to provide an ideal venue for all types of groups and activities. The Cockshutt Music Festival proved to be a great success with nine bands and musicians providing a fantastic mix of different styles of music. It was a fantastic evening with nearly 200 people attending. Everyone had a great time and our thanks go to 'Jonny' for the huge amount of work he put into organising the bands, the excellent food and promotion of the event. Our thanks also go to Julie and 'Posty' Postans for running and organising our bar. Believe me; they were kept very busy throughout the evening!

By the time this goes to print we will have had our charity 'Southern Belle' Ball with the proceeds going to the Church and the Millennium Hall. I am sure it will have been a great evening and all for a good cause.

We are always looking for different types of events that would be popular. If you feel like getting involved and have ideas that could be staged at the hall then please call me or get in touch with any of our committee members. I can assure you we would be very interested to hear from you. We meet on the first Wednesday of every month at 8.00pm at the hall and would love to see you.

Finally, it continues to cost a huge amount of money to maintain this great facility in Cockshutt and we really need your support as residents to keep it going. Do try and come to our events. ## *We need your views on childcare!*

Under the Childcare Act 2006, Shropshire Council is required to ensure sufficient childcare is available to meet the needs of working parents and those parents returning to work, education or training.

We are currently seeking the views of local people on childcare provision in this area. This will help identify gaps in provision and develop an action plan to close these gaps. A report will be published in March 2011.

This summer a questionnaire is being sent out to a random sample of households with children. Families who receive a questionnaire are being urged to take part in the survey. This will help ensure that the views of all communities are taken into account when shaping the future of childcare in Shropshire.

We will also be attending a variety of events and groups across the county to speak face to face to parents, carers, children, young people, employers, childcare providers and other local representatives – we look forward to hearing your views!

## *Community Testing Event*

This event was held on Thursday 13 May and a number of local residents took part. The purpose of the evening was to create an accurate snapshot of the Parish by working through a document providing existing information about the Parish and 'testing' it by giving personal perspective and knowledge. Feedback has been given to participants together with copies of the colour wheel, both at a table level and combined. A summary of the community benefits charts (the red stickers) has also been provided. Shropshire Council has committed to a follow-up meeting, the date is yet to be arranged.

## *Planning Consultation*

At its meeting on 24 June the Parish Council focused on its response to Shropshire Council's second major Planning Document, Site Allocations and Management Development which, when approved, will guide future development across Shropshire up to 2026.

### Pre-School

Cockshutt Pre-School returns on Tuesday 7th September. The Toddlers Group is a great way to meet new families and for children to socialise. It operates on Tuesdays from 9.30 until 11.30. When your child is two, they are welcome to come to our 'Two's Alone group' which runs every afternoon from 12.30 until 3pm.

Once your child reaches three they move into our morning sessions, they have now learnt how to be part of a social group, they know our expectations and have built up a relationship with adults and peers to be able to move onto the next stage of development.

We offer the fifteen hours of funded sessions which can be taken over five full days, 9-3. We have the added benefit of being able to link with Cockshutt Primary School to offer children aged three years and over a breakfast club and an after school club.

On top of all these wonderful opportunities for children to gain a broad education, they have also done very well in the recent SATs results and we continue to be amongst the best achieving Foundation Stage Classes in the County.
