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*Welcome* .. to the 14th edition of 'Our Parish Matters'. In the last edition I reported on the sad death of Eddie Jones. Not only did that leave a vacancy on the Parish Council but also with the position of Vice Chair of the Council. At the November Council meeting Cllr John Cooling put himself forward for the position and the Council unanimously supported him. Like all Councillors, John is available should you need any help or advice on local matters. The Council is now in the process of co-opting a new Councillor, please see the article below. If you are interested and want to know more about the role, please feel free to contact me or another Councillor. All contact details are on page 4 of the newsletter.

In January, the Council approved the Budget for the financial year 2014/15. One area the Council will be exploring during 2014/15 is an audit of the street lights in Cockshutt and whether they can be more efficient and better quality. The Council will concentrate on the lights along the main road first and then the lanes and areas off the main road. If you have any comments about the lights please let us know. The Parish Council maintains all the lights in Cockshutt except around The Meadows. These will be the responsibility of Shropshire Council.

Lastly, as I write this, the strong winds and heavy rain typical of this winter are battering our county again. If you are concerned about the safety of your home, please take up Shropshire Council's offer of a free flood protection check as explained on page 4.

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## *Parish Councillor vacancy*

Like previous vacancies, a formal Notice was displayed which allowed ten electors to call for an election to be held. An election was not requested and therefore the Parish Council has been authorised by Shropshire Council to fill the vacancy by Co-option. This means that, rather than the electorate voting for a Councillor, the Parish Council itself will vote as individuals for the candidate they believe will fulfil the role to the benefit of the community.

Candidates will still have to meet the legal qualifications and any person interested should apply in writing to the Clerk expressing their formal interest in the position. It is recommended that the letter includes a short personal background and explains why they have applied to become a Councillor. Prospective candidates should note that the term of office is to 2017, the date of the next round of Ordinary Parish Council elections. The deadline for applications has been set by the Parish Council as 31 March 2014.

The Parish Council has agreed the procedure for Co-option which will be held during its meeting on 10 April 2014. During the Public Statements section, candidates will be given the opportunity to give a brief presentation and answer any questions from the Council. Then at the appropriate point of the meeting, Councillors will vote for the new Councillor by secret paper ballot. The successful candidate will have to receive an absolute majority vote of those present and voting. Depending on the number of candidates, there may be several rounds of voting. After the vote has been taken, the Chairman will declare the candidate who received the highest number of votes, duly elected.

## *Local Joint Committees*

By the time you read this article the last meeting of the Ellesmere Local Joint Committee (LJC) in its current form will have taken place. A review of LJs is taking place.

What do LJs do?

Since 2009, 28 LJs have covered all of Shropshire and they meet several times a year. Local people are able to discuss issues, raise questions and call service providers to account. They also had money allocated from Shropshire Council which LJs used to fund local community projects.

Why do LJs need to change?

In response to decreasing budgets over the last few years Shropshire Council has become a 'commissioning' Council. This means rather than providing services on its own the Council will work with partners.

What could the role of LJs be?

LJs could become the local governance structure that empowers local Shropshire Councillors, town and parish councils, local communities and partners to make decisions about how public money is spent locally; they could in effect become local commissioners. Some of the questions to be considered are: What decisions could be made locally? What opportunities are there for delegating existing service budgets to LJs to spend? How do we understand the needs/demands of local communities, identify the resources available and agree local priorities.

The Parish Council will keep you up to date with all changes through this newsletter.

## *Jubilee Field update*

We have made some progress with the Jubilee Field project. An application was made to the Ellesmere Local Joint Committee, to secure a grant towards design and layout of the field. It is hoped that by the time you read this newsletter we would have been successful with the application.

In the meantime we have been lucky to secure the services of a design consultant, Chris Price, and it is hoped that an initial design and layout can be presented to the Parish Community in due course.

# Free Property Flood Protection Assessment

As flooding is so much in the news due to the recent weather conditions, we would like to remind you about the free property flood protection assessments which are offered by Shropshire Council.

Shropshire Council is working hard to manage flood risk across the county and is busy learning about the flooding issues that affect different areas.

As part of its approach, Shropshire Council is offering free residential property flood protection assessments, where internal flooding has been experienced. Assessments will be carried out by an approved surveyor who is independent of manufacturers of flooding related products. An assessment will be made of the likely routes of ingress for flood water entering your property, and measures that could be used to prevent or mitigate flood damage to your home will be suggested. After visiting, the surveyor will issue a brief report outlining their findings. You can then use the report to help plan protective measures for your property. Shropshire Council can provide further guidance on the types of products that are available.
