Welcome .. to the Autumn edition of Our Parish Matters. Summer holidays have now passed and Council meetings have re-commenced. Two topics discussed at the September Parish Council meeting are important to Cockshutt residents: adequate street lighting and the control of speeding traffic. The Parish Council owns and maintains all the street lights (with the exception of those by The Meadows) and it will be considering a plan of upgrading the lights and possibly part night lighting. Please let your Councillors know what you think, it will ensure the Council makes the right decisions for the community.

Speeding traffic is always a concern for residents and the Council is meeting with other Road Safety Groups to understand different methods of addressing this problem. We are also in discussions with Shropshire Council to ensure all they can provide is being actioned.

The Council is also working on a new website. Not only will it include all the documentation the Council has to make available to the public but it is planned to include areas dedicated to community groups. If you are part of a community group and wish to be included please contact the Parish Clerk.

I hope you enjoy reading this edition — as normal we have tried to cover a wide range of reports and information. However, if there is something missing you believe we should include please let us know!

## Your Place Plan!

'Place Plans' were introduced by Shropshire Council in 2011 as a way to document the aims and aspirations of towns and villages. To put it very simply, Place Plans are the collection of each Town and Parishes' own vision of what, in an ideal world, they would like their community to look like.

The Parish Council is now carrying out the annual review of our Place Plan and this year the Plan is expanding to include wider investment needs not just infrastructure. We need **your** help! What would make your village better? Do you need a service that would make your life easier? Would your community group expand if investment in any way was introduced? Let your Councillor know and we will include it in our Place Plan. Funding for suitable projects will be made available over time so make sure your needs and requests are included.

## The Jubilee Field

The Annual Parish Meeting held back in May explained the outline plans of the Jubilee Field and answered questions from residents about them. The next stage is to submit a formal planning application to Shropshire Council.

Once the application has been approved the project will commence on the most demanding but rewarding stage — the building of the new facilities! This stage will need willing members on the Advisory Committee to help steer the project and ensure work is properly scheduled and carried out to specification. ## Cockshutt Primary School and Nursery

Our new development this academic year is the link we have made with the Children's Centre services. We are going to work together to provide fun activities for families with children who are under 5. These will take place on the first Thursday of each month between 9.45 and 11.15 at the school and the sessions will be free. Please come along and support these sessions to ensure they continue; you are welcome whether or not you have children at the school. Under 5s, parents, carers and grandparents are all welcome. The Early Years Foundation Class (Reception and Nursery) will also be running a parent drop in between 8.45 and 9.45 on the same day when you can play with your child and borrow a book, again everyone is welcome. The first session will take place on Thursday 2nd October and the theme will be 'Itchy Bear', with activities to bring the story alive.

Again this academic year our school has grown, due I believe to the quality educational experiences and care we offer our children and the much loved Extended School services we provide. Wrap around care is available from 8am in the morning until 5.50 each evening, which I know is a

great help to our working families and enjoyed by the children who attend.

Our Early Years setting has really developed over the year and we are awaiting Ofsted any day, which I am sure will find our setting to have vastly improved and to be of a very high quality. We offer places for 3 year olds each day and for 2 year olds in the afternoon.

We are very proud of our school and what we have to offer. If you would like to see for yourself we are holding an Open Day on 30<sup>th</sup> September 9am to 4.30.

## Flu jabs!

This year there will be a change from the previous system of 2 days' drop in flu jab clinics in the Comrades Club. Any patients registered with Ellesmere Medical Practice who are over 65 or have any health issues making it advisable for them to be protected against 'flu should contact the surgery to book an appointment at one of the clinics being run at the surgery from 1 Oct.

There is no need to wait for an invitation letter or reminder - patients should just drop in or ring 01691 622798 / 623256 & speak to the receptionist. The 'flu jab does NOT give you 'flu. No-one pretends injections are pleasant, but any discomfort is minor and very short-lived - and is far, far less unpleasant than catching real 'flu!

## Shropshire Council Community Tree Scheme

We know it's early in the year to be thinking about tree planting, but our Tree Scheme is open for business once again.

We are running the Tree Scheme on a **first come - first served** basis. This means that applicants who meet the criteria will be awarded all the trees and hedging transplants they request, subject to availability and the maximum allowable limit of 100 trees and 60 hedging transplants per application. Once the total number of

available trees has been reached we will close the scheme. This means that you will need to **get your application in good and early** to stand the best chance of success.
