Welcome ..

to the first edition of 2015. It is hoped that this year will be an eventful year as the Parish Council is awaiting the decision on its planning application to develop the Jubilee Field. The Council submitted the application mid December and it is currently going through the consultation stage and we hope to hear good news soon!

In January each year the Council has to set its Budget for the following financial year. Discussions had taken place over the previous few months as there were a number of important considerations to take into account. The first is the withdrawal by Shropshire Council of the element previously paid under the Council Tax Support Grant. Last year this amounted to £1,111. During the year the Council had investigated the possibility of a gradual replacement of the type of street lighting in the Parish and it was agreed that a phased replacement of 'old style' lights to LED ones would take place. The Council has made a provision of £1,000 to cover the start of this project. The other main consideration is the development of the Jubilee Field and a provision of £1,500 has been made towards this. As a result of all these factors it was considered necessary to increase the precept, the amount raised through the Council Tax, by approximately £3,500 to £16,000. Although this is a large percentage increase, the Council reviewed the impact of the increase in monetary terms for tax payers. For a Council Tax Band D taxpayer the annual cost will now be £57.42 or £1.11 per week, an increase from an annual cost of £44.99 or 87p per week. Speed Watch

Excessive or inappropriate speeding is dangerous and is responsible for many unnecessary injuries and collisions. It is a serious traffic offence which affects the quality of life of many communities. The Police use a variety of schemes, education and enforcement to address speeding and West Mercia Police has recently launched its Community Speed Watch (CSW) scheme.

What is CSW?

CSW schemes are coordinated by the police but managed and run by volunteers in the community. The aim of CSW is NOT to catch as many speeding drivers as possible. It aims to encourage motorists to drive at a safe and appropriate speed, reduce speed in areas of concern, re-educate drivers about the dangers of speeding and address concerns from local residents about cars speeding through their communities.

How does CSW work?

At specified safe locations, volunteers monitor the speed of passing vehicles with a hand-held speed detection device. Offending vehicles' details are recorded on a log sheet, including the names and signatures of the volunteers witnessing the offence and other key information.

Will Cockshutt have a CSW scheme.

For many years the Parish Council and residents of Cockshutt have been concerned about the speed of traffic going through the village. Together with the local Police Safer Neighbourhood Team, the Parish Council will help set up a scheme if enough volunteers come forward.

Can anyone become a volunteer?

Schemes are open to anyone aged 18 or over. Volunteers will only be accepted onto a scheme once appropriate checks have been carried out. Volunteers must be able to make a regular commitment to carry out their activity and must adhere to the scheme's safety rules at all times. Although reasonable adjustments can be made, volunteers should be mindful of the physical nature of the role. Training will be provided covering areas such as health and safety, legislation and how to use the speed detection equipment.

West Mercia Police reserve the right to withdraw permission for an individual to participate in a local scheme.

Superfast Broadband in the Parish

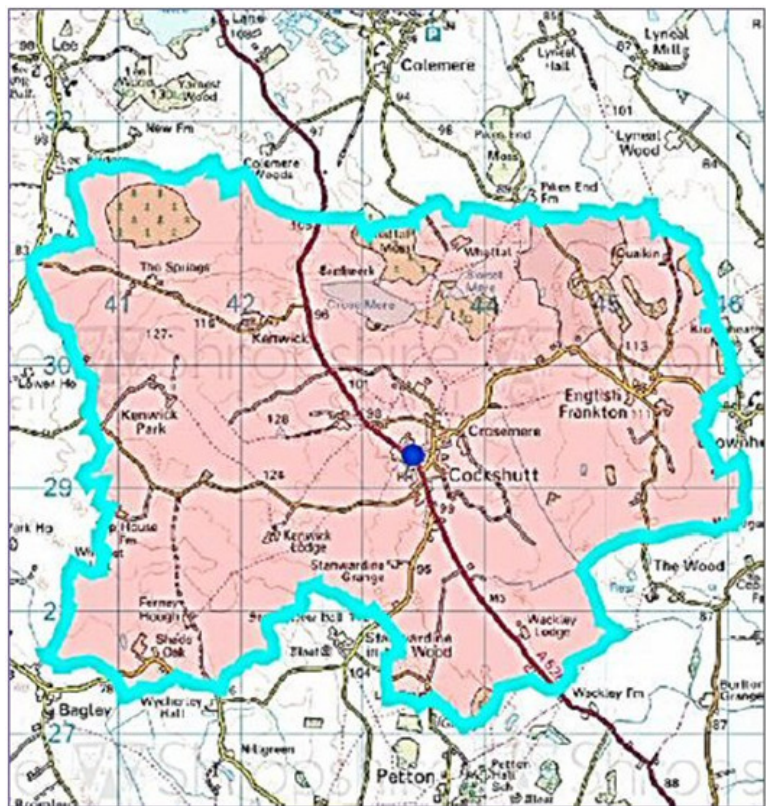
At the end of 2014 the Parish Council took a presentation from the Connecting Shropshire team.

Fibre Optic technology can uplift broadband speeds to a possible 52MBPS, with the present average for the parish being between 2 to 7 MBPS. When the work is completed, residents will need to apply to their provider to switch to the new Fibre Optic service as it will not be an automatic connection.

We understand that Phase 1 is now underway which will include Cockshutt, with the survey work to commence in 2015. There will be two Fibre Optic Cabinets in Cockshutt, one at the junction of Shrewsbury Road and Crosemere, and the second cabinet by the present telephone exchange.

The new cabinets are required to accommodate the new technology as the present analogue exchange cannot accept the fibre optics directly.

The new service will be available to 341 premises within the Cockshutt area.



Unfortunately, the present phase does not include the Petton area, I quote from the statement provided by the Connecting Shropshire team:

"The projections for the parish of Petton is not as positive as Cockshutt I'm afraid. All premises are showing as Exchange Only (EO) lines with speeds of over 2Mbps. None in the parish are currently included in our plans to be upgraded to fibre as part of our Phase 1 deployment. As the programme moves forwards (Phase 1 is due to complete winter 2016) we will continue to review these plans. There still remain opportunities to potentially add in additional structures that will serve more premises and this may include areas such as Petton"

The Parish Council will endeavour to keep you informed as phase 1 progresses, and as more information becomes available.
