Annual Parish Meeting

Thursday, 12th April 2018 7:00 pm

The Annual Parish Meeting will take place prior to the Parish Council Meeting. It is not a parish council meeting but a more informal way of community engagement. It is an opportunity to put forward ideas, discuss any issue or topic or make comment on matters which electors feel affect their local community. Any elector in the parish has a right to vote at this meeting.

Cockshutt Parish Paths (P3) Update

The P3 group held a work party recently with Helen Beresford from Shropshire Council, to replace the footbridge and upgrade the stile to a kissing gate over the brook at English Frankton. Many hands made light work and the sun shone for us. This now improves access from the east of Cockshutt to English Frankton.

The P3 group meets every Wednesday morning at 9.30am and we walk for an hour or so, assessing the condition of the footpaths and bridleways in Cockshutt and Petton, cutting back vegetation where necessary, while chatting and exercising in the great outdoors. There is also a Sunday Afternoon Stroll on the second Sunday of the month, starting at 2pm outside the Village Hall. Traffic Calming

The Vehicle Activated Sign is now operational at the southern end of the village. We have received positive feedback that it is making a difference, although it must be said that new signage of any description will not deter some drivers from speeding through the village.

As you may know, we had further traffic calming plans for the centre and northern end of the village due to be implemented this year. Unfortunately, we have been informed by Highways that due to a cutback of £5m this financial year, and a further £5m next year it is not looking good for these plans to go ahead. We are informed that Shropshire Council have further meetings planned to establish which schemes can be taken forward. We will of course keep you informed as and when we have more information

Defibrillator Update

Fund-raising has been going much better than we ever expected last summer when we first set out to raise money to buy a defibrillator for Cockshutt village. We had thought that we were still some way off our target, but just at the right time we heard that Cockshutt school has the opportunity to purchase a defibrillator at a favourable rate (and purchasing through the school means that it would be exempt from VAT which makes a big difference to the final cost). It makes perfect sense therefore to donate all funds raised so far to Cockshutt School for the purchase and installation of a defibrillator. Although the school will be the channel for the purchase, the defibrillator will be installed on an outside wall of the school, accessible to, and for the use of, the entire community.
