Dear Residents.

Welcome to this first edition of Our Parish Matters since the local government elections in May this year. There were 7 vacancies for Cockshutt Ward and 1 for Petton Ward. Six of the existing Cockshutt Councillors stood for re-election whilst John Cooling, the Parish Council's Chair since May 2017 decided to stand down. We were pleased to learn that long term Cockshutt resident Peter Griffiths stood for election and thereby making up the numbers for the Ward. Sadly, nobody from Petton applied, but the Council would welcome an application for cooption to represent that important part of the Parish. As the number of candidates for the Cockshutt Ward matched the number of vacancies an election was therefore not necessary.

I should like to thank John for the leadership and enthusiasm during his 4 years as Chair as well as his 6 years beforehand as a councillor. His calm, yet authoritative style is to be commended and his gentle persuasiveness enabled him to achieve much and resulted in him being able to recruit a completely new set of councillors during his tenure. This takes me onto introducing myself as one John's recruits just over 3 years ago and now finding myself as Chairman for this year at least. With my family I moved to Cockshutt in 1986 and since then the whole family have been involved with Cockshutt life, notably the school, cubs & scouts, the hall, the steering group for the Parish Plan and now the Parish Council. I am a retired Civil Engineer, a tinkerer of old cars and a lifelong DIY exponent. I look forward to serving you all in my new role.

Since May we have been holding our meetings in person at the Millennium Hall in a Covid compliant manner and I and the other Councillors would really like to see you there and hear about your issues and concerns. Each meeting has 10 minute slot at the beginning where members of the public can bring up any issues of concern which we will try to address during that period or afterwards and if appropriate make it an agenda item for the following meeting.

Finally, I can report that the patio paving outside the lounge area of the Millennium Hall (a joint venture between the Hall & the PC) has been completed and is ready for use. I believe that there are plans to surround it with some fencing and planting, which will make it into an even more attractive area.

Over the summer, members of the Cockshutt P3 group have been busy every Wednesday morning walking the rights of way around Cockshutt and Petton and clearing vegetation from around the stiles and kissing gates to ensure that the footpaths are maintained and are accessible. We walk for an hour or two, three to five miles chatting and exercising in the great outdoors.


Library van
