103/22 Public Participation –

A resident asked about Speed Watch - why isn't it monitored more often and can it be done at the northern end of village?

The Chairman explained that for operational reasons there are limited locations in the village from where Speed Watch can be monitored.

The number of times that Speed Watch is monitored is mainly due to lack of volunteers. Volunteers experience is that Speed Watch is most effective if efforts are concentrated at the southern end of the village.

NHS in Crisis:

The Parish Council received a presentation from NHS in Crisis Campaign which concentrates on the issues associated with the ambulance service in Shropshire.

Residents are likely to be familiar with the difficulties with response times, either from the news or personal experience.

NHS in Crisis identified that among others the main and immediate difficulty is patient discharge due to lack of availability of patient support in the social care system. To restore the flow, free up beds and ultimately allow faster transfer from ambulance to appropriate hospital care requires investment in the Hospital Discharge Programme. The longer term aim is to ask the CQC to investigate the causes of failing healthcare in Shropshire.

NHS in Crisis is appealing for support to lobby the government to improve and secure the future of healthcare in Shropshire.

- d. Wildflower Meadow –
Members received Cllr. Harrison’s suggestion to the purchase of wildflower seed from Meadowmania circa. £286.70. The timetable for sowing is during the autumn for the benefit of spring flowering.

108/22 Environmental Maintenance:

The Chairman had instructed a local contractor to cut back the brambles along the footpath along from the telephone box. Some clearance has happened whether by our contractor or local landowner is uncertain. No invoice received to date.

109/22 Jubilee Field

The wildflower area has been mown. Cllr. Harrison is investigating costs of planting around the patio area. It is too late this year for planting lavender as suggested, so defer this until spring. The cost of plants is approx. £200. If we used reconditioned oak sleepers to create raised beds this would be circa. £30 per sleeper plus VAT x12.

Clerk will ask Mike Deegan for his availability, preferably daytime and circulate dates.

Currently the hawthorn in the new hedge planting seems to be surviving, other species it is too early to tell given the extreme dry weather.
