APM03/24 Annual Report of the Parish Council

The Parish Council has taken on board the issues raised in Crosemere Crescent with the pumping station and flooding in that area. The Parish Council has written to Severn Trent Water Authority about this matter, correspondence & discussion is ongoing.

The Parish Council set the precept for this year the same as it was last year, which is no increase to ratepayers.

APM04/24 Parish Debate

The Chair of the Village Hall Committee thanked the Parish Council for its support during the year. The Village Hall Committee again raised ongoing concerns regarding illegal activities on the Hall Car Park and are installing a new camera. They also proposed posts and chain at the entrance to prevent overnight parking. The VH Committee would like to install a post between the footpath/vehicle access from Shrewsbury Road to the playing field.

The Speedwatch group are depleted at the moment and are looking for more volunteers to continue this initiative.

Streetlighting has been an issue in recent months, unusually it has taken some considerable time and the streetlights reported as not working are still not repaired.

A resident suggested that the verges at the entrance to village on the Cockshutt-Loppington road could be improved. The Parish Council to investigate.

The Clerk handed the official portrait of the King to the Chairman of the Village Hall Committee for hanging in the Hall.
