87/26 Apologies for absence:

88/26 Public Participation:

A resident raised the matter of noise and damage to the youth shelter & suggested that the shelter be re-located. The Chair explained the reasons behind the current location & that the PC is in discussion with its contractor to try and make the panelling more robust to avoid further damage.

A resident raised the issue of overgrown hedges on the corner of Kenwick Close/Shrewsbury Road.

A member of the Village Hall Committee attended the meeting and provided an update on the formation and ongoing development of the Village Hall Committee. The Hall is in need of a new alarm system which will necessitate an upgrade to the electricity consumer unit; the Committee are in the process of obtaining quotes.

- d. Request for financial assistance for the ongoing upkeep of the Village Hall
 Discussion regarding the financial position of the Village Hall Charity, which appears to be good. Members noted the need for a new alarm system; the Committee intend to submit an application for funding on receipt of quotes. CCP-PC are committed to supporting Hall Committee to preserve this community facility & suggested a review of bookings, in particular hire fees.
- e. Email provider
 In conjunction with item 99/26b clerk updated members. The legislation deals with addresses but not private telephone numbers. Clerk has currently removed all numbers from the website and will investigate the use of a virtual local CCP-PC number along with other email providers.
- f. Land registration
 Members were in agreement that any remaining unregistered land in Council ownership should be registered. Clerk to contact the solicitors holding the title deeds and report back to September meeting.

Chair to progress youth shelter repairs with CCP-PC contractor. Review the position of CCTV warning signs.

Hedges alongside the Flash, Crosemere Road, are overgrown affecting highway visibility. A question arose regarding the land ownership and responsibility, clerk to investigate.

96/26 Jubilee & Football Field

- a. Work is progressing well on the new parking area with a view to completion by 14th July.
- b. CCP-PC is awaiting quotes for the jetting and repair of the drains from Shrewsbury road across Wimbourne Cottages and Jubilee Field to the manhole on the SW boundary of the field.
- c. Request from the Village Hall Committee in respect of the play area, that the Parish Council formally adopt the fixtures thereon - play equipment, fences & gates, play surfaces

Members discussed and agreed in principle to the adoption of the play equipment. However, they requested further information regarding exactly what responsibilities would be transferred before making a final decision

Village Hall Committee to forward the recent ROSPA report to the Council

- d. Request for assistance with regard to ongoing maintenance of other outside spaces in VH Charity ownership.
Members discussed and agreed in principle to include the outside spaces in CCP-PC maintenance contracts including the existing car park, deferring the final decision along with the play area to September meeting.
